Co-Teaching

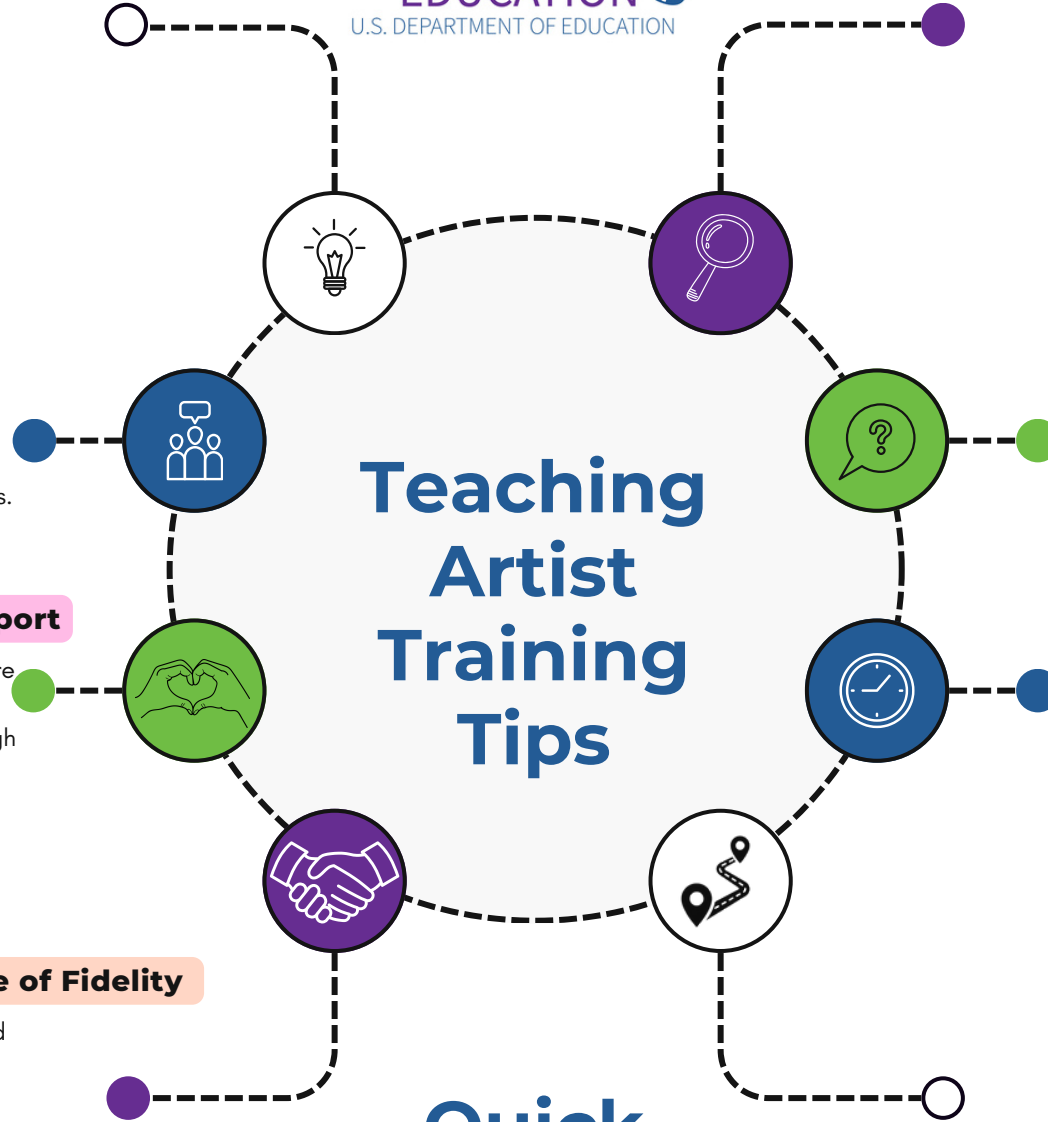
Whenever possible, leverage the benefits of Teaching Artist Co-Teaching. This model allows for support, safety, and differentiated instructional approaches for students.

Provide Emotional Support

Invest in your Teaching Artists. Explore ways to support and develop their social and emotional wellness through community and relationship building.

Understand Importance of Fidelity

The project will need to progress and be implemented in an agreed upon way. Ensure Teaching Artists understand the importance of implementing with fidelity.



Identify Desired Skillset

Determine the skillsets necessary for the types of Teaching Artists needed for the project.

Tell your project's 'Why'

Communicate consistently and regularly the 'why' to your Teaching Artists. .

Calendar Time

Plan for and budget for appropriate training time for your Teaching Artists. Include onboarding, semesterly/quarterly/unit trainings and informal observations.

Provide Guidance

Regardless of their tenure or abilities, all Teaching Artists can benefit from coaching and guidance. Create a culture of support. .
